## DCTA's Positive Train Control (PTC) Progress Report

We're committed to rail safety and are working diligently to implement [Positive Train Control \(PTC\)](#) by the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA). PTC was designed to prevent collisions and other incidents by automatically detecting and controlling the movement of trains. We were the first public
